## **First Lesson: Acts 10:34-43**

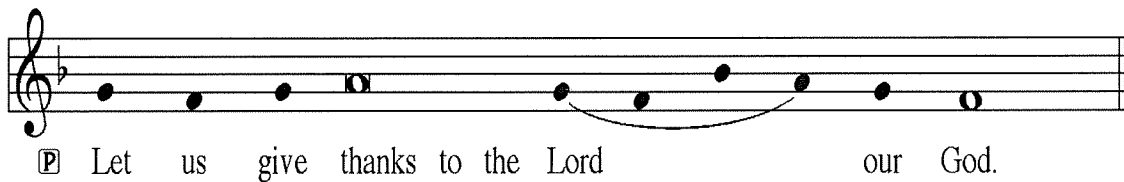
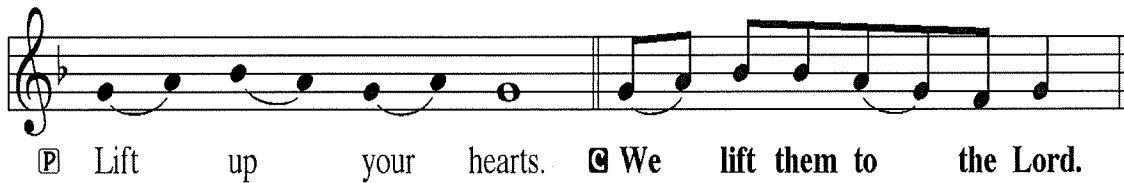
